This highlight for Tower Tidings is written to update the congregation on the work of the Session in April/May 2024.

Session met on May 1, 2024 instead of the fourth week in April, due to the vacation of Pastor Rice. There will be two Session meetings held in May. During the meeting last evening, the Clerk reported no changes in membership during the month of April. Tom Rumbaugh, from the Resource Development Team, presented March 2024 financial information which also included a quarterly update on investments. A budget for 2024 was presented for review and will be voted on by the Session at the May 29<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Pastor Rice reported on his latest activities and pastoral concerns from within the congregation and community. Reports from the various ministry teams were heard. Fun activities such as a recent Euchre tournament, potluck lunch on May 5, and the Over 80's luncheon in June were presented. The outreach of the Faith and Practice team through Meals for All and other community projects continues to grow. The teams of Faith and Structure and Faith and Worship plan to meet in May.

Mimi Lewellen from Nominating Committee presented the slate of Elders and Deacons that will be voted on at the congregational meeting on May 5. Laura Neill from Personnel reported on upcoming changes in the Board of Pensions benefits and also presented the Pastor's Terms of Call to Session for information only. This also will receive a congregational vote at the annual meeting.

Another attempt was made this month to make the Session meeting accessible via Zoom. Once again, this attempt proved to be unsuccessful, so Amy Baxstrom's report was completed via text to the Clerk. She has completed the intergenerational Sunday School series that she planned as part of her Christian Educator certification. Amy also wrote and submitted a reKindle grant proposal to Columbia Theological Seminary. Pastor Rice reported that Amy has recently met with the leadership of Eventide and some new ideas for that worship experience are forming.

Members of Session will continue to meet on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Please reach out to any of the Elders listed above with any questions or concerns. Positive feedback is also welcomed as this team is working diligently to listen, discern and communicate successfully. The April 26th tournament was a great success - we had 25 people/6 tables!





Another option is, if the paper only has one line of sensitive info, cut or tear out that portion and put it in trash with wet coffee grounds or compost and the rest of the page can be recycled.

The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of former member Nancy Anderson who died April 16, 2024 in Florida. Nancy was born in Dover, Ohio, graduated from Altoona High School, and earned a BSN from Alfred University. Nancy and her husband Ken, who enjoyed 56 years of marriage, lived in Rhode Island, California, and Wisconsin before moving to Wooster in the mid-1980's. They relocated to the Penney Retirement Community in Penney Farms, Florida in 2018.

Nancy was employed by the College of Wooster for 32 years, starting as a nurse and rising to become director of the

Longbrake Student Wellness Center. Nancy was passionate about mentoring young adults and broadening their cultural horizons. She and Ken traveled widely and served as a host family for many C.O.W. international students over the years.

Nancy was an active member of FPC for over thirty years. She served as an elder and member of the Pastor Nominating Committee and worked with youth. She and Ken participated in the FPC trips to Switzerland in 1993 and to Ghost Ranch in 2000.

Nancy is survived by her husband Ken, her daughters Julie and Kate, and three grandchildren. Celebration of life gatherings will be held May 2 in Penney Farms and September 29 in Wooster.
