More information on that will be coming in the next month.

This highlight for Tower Tidings is written to update the congregation on the work of the Session in January 2025. This meeting took place on January 29, 2025. It was rescheduled from January 22, 2025 due to weather conditions.

Session members gathered to hear information from the ministry teams, Nominating,

Personnel and RDM, as well as Pastor Rice. Several of the teams did not meet in the months of

December and January, but their ministries continue as planned. Amy Baxstrom sent a message to

be read at the meeting as she is attending the Christian Educator's conference in Memphis this

week. She reported that she is thankful for the opportunity to learn and worship with colleagues

and is gathering new ideas for FPC.

Mimi Lewellen reported that the Nominating team will have their first meeting next week.

They will be working to find members who are willing to be Elders and Deacons for the next three years. Excerpts from FPC Polity are included below to explain the responsibilities of each of these leadership positions.

The Session is the council for the local congregation. The Session shall have responsibility for governing the congregation and guiding its witness...so that the congregation becomes a community of faith, hope, love and witness. (*Book of Order*)

Session Highlights

- Serve as the "ruling body" of the local church while nurturing the corporate Christian faith of the congregation.
- Lead the congregation in participating in the mission of the church.
- Ensure that the programs of the church provide opportunities for worship, Christian growth and fellowship, pastoral care, education and service opportunities.
- Challenge the congregation to responsible stewardship.
- Oversee the maintenance of membership rolls.
- Supervise, evaluate, and approve actions of Coordinating Teams, task forces, and boards within the congregation.
- In conjunction with Faith and Structure, determine appropriate use for all church properties.
- Delegate congregational members to attend meetings of the Presbytery, the Synod and the General Assembly.
- When elected as commissioners to higher ruling bodies, Elders participate and vote with the same authority as a Teaching Elder, and are eligible for any office.
- Maintain ecumenical relationships.
- Appoint members to special task forces.
- Instruct, examine, ordain, install and welcome new Elders.
- Inform the congregation of all significant decisions and activities

The ministry of Deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures or anyone in distress. (*Book of Order*)

- Occasions for contact with parishioners may be times of personal celebrations including births, marriages, anniversaries, etc., as well as casual contacts as opportunities arise. Contacts may include personal visits, letters and cards, telephone calls and e-mail communications. Those contacts will be reported to the Moderator of Deacons.
- Each Deacon is assigned a parish. If the Deacon is unable to maintain contact with members in that parish for an extended period of time, the Deacon should contact the Moderator of Deacons who will assign temporary coverage.

Members of Session will continue to meet on the 4th Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Please reach out to any of the Elders listed above with any questions or concerns. Positive feedback is also welcomed as this team is working diligently to listen, discern and communicate successfully. 




