Sunday mornings continue to be a focal point of our week, with a new session of ARISE, Adult Education experiencing the thoughtful perspectives of author Barbara Brown Taylor, and our young people nurtured through age-appropriate Sunday School, including our current Confirmation Class.

A new year inevitably brings some changes with it, and for us that means the YMCA Creative Academy is moving on to a new partnership with The Village Network. Hoping not to have our wonderful facilities stand idle for long, we will be looking for another young children's educational opportunity to find a home with us.

Perhaps the highlight of our January will be hosting once again the annual community-wide Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration on January 20. In lieu of the customary guest keynote speaker, the program will feature a "jazz oratorio" composed by renowned jazz bassist Christian McBride, entitled *The Movement Revisited: A Musical Portrait of Four Icons*, and conducted by J.D. Steele from Minneapolis. The musical groups involved will be the College of Wooster Jazz Ensemble and the newly reconstituted College of Wooster Gospel Choir, supplemented with musicians and singers from the community. Four narrators will give voice to the words of Rosa Parks, Mohammed Ali, Malcolm X, and Martin Luther King, Jr., and I will have the privilege of voicing Dr. King. I hope we fill the sanctuary for this extraordinary presentation!







*The MLK Celebration Service at 7pm will feature the presentation of the Essay Winners, Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing, and the Free Will Offering for a local youth organization in addition to *The Movement Revisited*.



The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of longtime member Elizabeth Hooker who died November 30, 2024. Elizabeth was raised on a farm in Adams Mills, Ohio and graduated from Coshocton High School. She earned a B.A. in Speech from Denison University in 1965 and an M.A. in Speech Pathology and Audiology from Case Western Reserve University in 1967. She worked as a teacher and audiologist in New Jersey and later studied communication disorders and conducted research on aphasia at The Ohio State University.


Elizabeth met her husband Bob at Denison and they enjoyed 55 years of marriage before Bob passed away in 2022. Elizabeth and Bob donated the grand piano in the Sanctuary in honor of their 50th wedding anniversary in 2017.

Elizabeth was a lifelong Presbyterian and a member of FPC for over fifty years. She was an ordained Elder and Deacon, taught Sunday School, and served on many committees. In honor of her service to the church, she received an Honorary Life Membership Award from Presbyterian Women in the PC (USA).

As an advocate of liberal arts education, Elizabeth was a volunteer for The College of Wooster for more than 30 years to provide social, academic and financial support to students, especially women and international students. She served on the Women's Advisory Board for 27 years, including two terms as president, represented the community on the Wooster Leadership Group of the College, and established the Scott Family Endowed Scholarship.

Elizabeth was a founding member of The Women's Fund and Give 365 Wayne County at the Wayne County Community Foundation. She served on the boards of the Wooster YMCA and the City of Wooster Planning Commission and was active in many community organizations.

Elizabeth is survived by her daughter and son-in-law Mary Stockton and Jeff Perkins, her son Scott Hooker, and her grandchildren Scott, Elizabeth, and Henry Perkins and Charlotte and Andrew Hooker. A memorial service was held at FPC on December 21.





The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of longtime member George Spencer who died on December 14, 2024 at the age of 97.

George was born on the family farm near Fredericksburg and graduated from Fredericksburg High School. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy at age 18 during World War II and served on the U.S. Kearsarge. He married his late wife Marilyn in 1955.

George served as the Postmaster in Fredericksburg for a brief time and later worked at Borg Warner and the O.A.R.D.C., where he retired in 1988 as the

Maintenance Supervisor. He was active in the Masons, coached Little League, and was an avid golfer and reader. George and Marilyn wintered in Florida for many years and most recently George resided at West View Healthy Living.

George is survived by his daughter Debra and son Rick, two grandchildren, and two greatgrandchildren. A memorial service will be held at FPC on January 25 at 12:00 p.m. with lunch following.



The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of the Rev. Susan Russell, who died at her home in Salem, Massachusetts on December 26, 2024. Susan was the wife of former FPC Director of Music and Organist Jack Russell.

Susan was born in Boston and raised in Foxborough, Massachusetts. She earned a Bachelor of Music Education from the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music in 1965 and taught music in elementary schools in Connecticut, Illinois, and Vermont. After moving to Wooster when her husband Jack joined the music faculty at the College of Wooster, Susan served as Associate Director of

Admissions at the College for 12 years. Following a period of discernment, Susan enrolled at Seabury-Western Seminary in Evanston, Illinois and received a Master of Divinity degree in 1998. She was ordained a priest in The Episcopal Church and served parishes in Medina, Parma, and several towns in Massachusetts. At the time of her passing she was Associate Rector for Pastoral Care at Christ Church of Hamilton & Wenham in South Hamilton, Massachusetts.

Susan is survived by her husband Jack, her sons David and Timothy and their spouses, and four grandchildren. A memorial service will be held at Christ Church of Hamilton & Wenham on February 22, 2025.







Lois is survived by her husband John, seven grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.

Sandy is survived by her husband Jeff, a sister, and several nieces and nephews. A funeral service was held in Shreve on December 11.





The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of former FPC Parish Associate Ralph Fogal, who died on January 6, 2025 at the age of 99. Ralph was born in Greenville, Pennsylvania and raised on a nearby farm. He graduated from Thiel College, where he met his wife Lois, in 1950 and from Western Theological Seminary (now Pittsburgh Theological Seminary) in 1953.

Ralph served as pastor of six Presbyterian churches in Pennsylvania, Michigan, and Ohio during 35 years of active ministry. Following his retirement in 1988, Ralph continued to serve as interim pastor, hospice chaplain, Director of Wayne United Ministries, Parish Associate at FPC, and airport driver for the College of Wooster. Ralph and Lois also spent three months as PC(USA) Volunteers in Mission at Sheldon Jackson College in Sitka, Alaska. In 2001 they moved to a retirement center in Zelienople, Pennsylvania. They enjoyed 68 years of marriage until Lois's death in 2022. In recent years Ralph lived in Lake City, Iowa to be closer to family.

Ralph is survived by his daughter Sylvia and son Paul and their spouses, five grandchildren, and seven great-grandchildren. A Celebration of Life was held in Iowa on January 9, 2025 and a memorial service will be held in Pennsylvania at a later date.
