P.S. I have been personally extremely distressed and even angered by the vicious, damaging attacks on our Haitian brothers and sisters in Springfield, Ohio. On the following page, I have included an article from the September newsletter of the La Gonave Haiti Partners that speaks to the terrible injustice we have witnessed.

Decades ago, my father started the work of the Presbyterian Church in Haiti in partnership with the Episcopal Church of Haiti. In time, he took particular interest in La Gonave, a deeply impoverished island which sits off the coast across from Port-au-Prince. I traveled there with him on several occasions, and following his death was able to attend the dedication of a medical clinic bearing his name.

Monthly Newsletter September 2024

Our purpose at LGHP is to support the people of La Gonâve, Haiti. Today, we want to highlight an escalating and frightening situation for Haitian migrants in Springfield, Ohio. We stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters as harassment towards Haitian migrants increases in the wake of false claims targeting them.

After more than 30 years as partners with our friends in Haiti, spending time together has taught us what we have in common and how we can learn from one another. Under the TPS program, or Temporary Protected Status, Haitians legally seek refuge in the U.S. to escape crippling financial circumstances and danger at home. Many migrants were granted TPS after the 2010 earthquake. Some of La Gonâve's best and brightest have been drawn out of the country through TPS, leaving a gap in expert school teachers, healthcare workers, and other professions. The person working in a factory or warehouse in the U.S. may have been a business owner or nurse in Haiti.

The Haitian diaspora in the U.S. share their stories and the hardships they are facing. The news about misrepresentation and lies projected onto Haitian migrants in the U.S. has created shock waves in Haiti as well. Those who left their home country to work incredibly hard in search of a better life find racism and intolerance on the other side.

As followers of Jesus, we see the attributes Haitians share with Christ- injustice, sorrow, enduring hope, radical forgiveness and longsuffering. We correct our well-intentioned friends who ask if voudou is a possibility as they search for a simple "good" explanation, a hope that this is all just an unintentional misunderstanding. We reply that it's unfortunately a very intentional ugliness, a strategy to frame an "outsider" as deserving of scorn, fear and casting-out. It's not about the pets, it was never about the pets.

We are dedicated to supporting the Haitian community, both at home and abroad. It is our hope that one day, through partnerships like ours, Haitians will create a country they do not need to flee. In the meantime, let us use this time to be advocates for Haiti and serve as examples of compassion and respect.

First Presbyterian Church Exterior Maintenance

The current First Presbyterian Church was built in 1927. According to Dr. Mark A. Wilson from the College of Wooster, our church has a limestone façade. He describes it further "Indeed, the stone used in the main church building is a beautiful limestone. This particular variety is called (Indiana Limestone) informally and likely is from the Salem Formation in Indiana. It is made almost entirely of tiny calcareous fossils and shows interesting ripples and dunes. Its age is Lower Carboniferous, which is about 350 million years old. Andrews Library and parts of Kauke Hall on the College of Wooster campus used this same stone.

Our job as Session, RDM, and congregation members of First Presbyterian is to preserve this magnificent structure. Part of that process is to periodically pressure wash the limestone and to tuck point where cement has failed. We contacted Tim Lockard at the college to look for advice as to how we should proceed. He suggests "a good soap and water solution with a low pressure setting and no acid based cleaners."

The tuck pointing should be done by a professional cement/concrete mason. We are contacting Presbytery and other churches who have done the same pressure washing and/or tuck pointing for advice and possible prices. We also have the name of several restoration companies who do this type of work.

In the past, the cost of the limestone maintenance has been around \$100,000.00. We use the church building for so many church mission projects. Therefore it is important to protect and maintain the structure. RDM and Session will be looking for ways to enable the financial commitment this maintenance will cost. We hope the congregation can get on board as their financial situation permits. This is not an every year cost, but is a periodic constant expense.






Friday Fellowship

On Friday, September 27, Lake Susan and Flat Creek swelled to historic levels following heavy rainfall brought on by Hurricane Helene. High water levels caused catastrophic flooding throughout the town of Montreat. In addition, high winds brought down trees and power lines, contributing to widespread outages of power and water. At this time, communication is limited due to regional phone outages. As more information is available, we will deliver updates through montreat.org and through social media.




